




Local Trends - Boulder County Area



Assaults up compared to other violent crimes




Motor Vehicle Thefts and Theft from Auto up

Sexual Assault reports down. Calls to Crisis Centers up.



 Summer Month Spike in Calls for Service






Calls for Service Breakdown

- Little discretionary time for proactive policing work






Crime Distribution: Violent Crime

 - 23% Unknown
















Crime Distribution: Property Crime






Burglaries

Motor Vehicle Theft






Motor Vehicle Thefts





Thefts/Other Larceny





 Downtown Boulder – cluster surrounding Boulder Bus Station



Problem-Solving: *Increase in Domestic Violence*


- Evidence-based crime reduction projects
- Often underreported





Domestic Violence: *What are We Doing?*

- Lethality Assessment
 - Process of identifying DV victims who are in serious physical danger
- Connect victims with SPAN (Safehouse Progressive Alliance of Nonviolence) OR BPD Victim Advocates to provide services and resources.
- Co-Response on serious cases of domestic violence
- Officers currently being trained on lethality assessment






• 995 Stolen Bicycles This Year!

Average Value of Bicycle - \$1.8K






- Identified Hot Spot Locations
